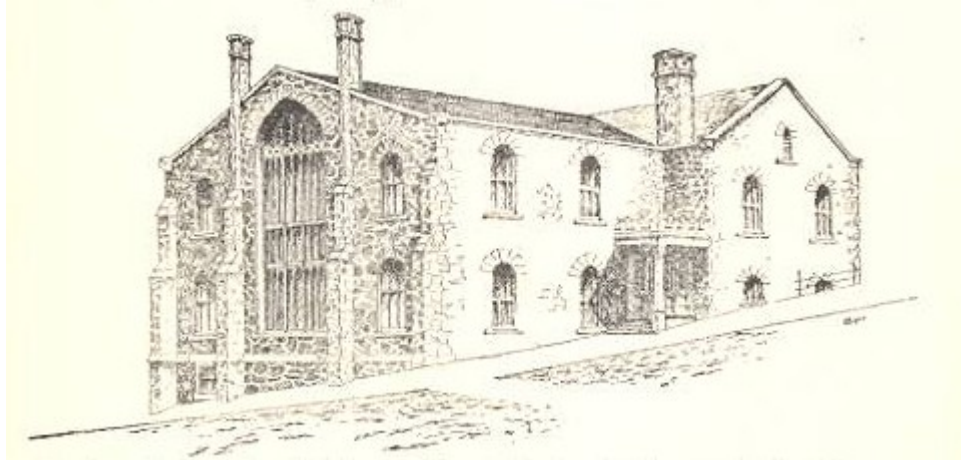


## Parish House

July 1905 rendering found in the Trinity Church Monthly of the proposed Parish House.



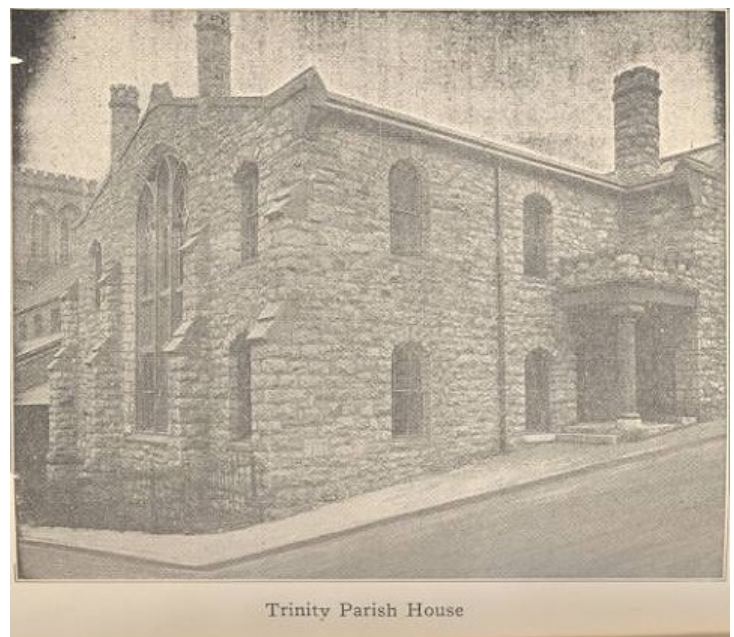
**Description** of the proposed parish house from the July 1905 Trinity Church Monthly: The parish house will be a two-story stone structure somewhat similar in design to the church building. The main entrance will be on Second Street. Going through the hall, which will extend right through to the choir room, the first door on the right will enter into the reading room, connected with which will be the game room. Back of these rooms, in the southeast corner of the building, will be the chapel with a seating capacity for forty or fifty people. Opposite the reading rooms will be a room for the various meetings of the ladies and of their organizations. Back of this and connected with it by rolling doors will be the infant Sunday school room. When occasion requires, these rooms can be thrown into one to afford accommodations for one hundred or more people.

If upon entering the building on Second Street we turn at once to the right, a stairway will lead to the second floor. This will be one large room and will be used by the Sunday school and will serve as an auditorium for large gatherings. Extending off the south end of it will be a kitchen, so that this room may also be used to serve supper.

Connecting the church and parish house, but on a level with the floor of the church will be the choir room. This room will be formed by extending the ambulatory back to the parish building. The capacity of the present robing room will thus be doubled. It is estimated that the total cost of the building will be between fifteen and sixteen thousand dollars (\$15,000-\$16,000), the heat being supplied by the steam heat plant now in use in the church.

**Cornerstone contents:** The cornerstone was laid by Bishop Talbot on June 21, 1905. Within the cornerstone was placed a Bible, a prayer book, copies of the local papers and the Diocesan Record, coins of the year 1905, photographs of the bishop, rector emeritus and rector, a copy of The Parish Monthly containing the names of the clergy, the vestry, the officers and teachers of Sunday Schools, the officers of the different parochial organizations, and the joint committee on the parish house.



## Parish House - St. Luke's Chapel

**St. Luke's Chapel** was built in 1905-1906 when the parish house was built. The chapel was built on the first level along with a two room lounge, offices, a small reception area, and a kitchenette.



**St. Luke's Chapel - 1958: Plaque on back wall:** This Chapel remodeled to the Glory of God and in Loving Memory of Anna Henning Luther by her Family - June 1955. The remodeling referred to the extensive wood scroll work done around the three windows and the altar rail. The picture was taken in 1958. Note the pine wood ceiling, recessed lighting and linoleum floors.

**St. Luke's Chapel - 2004:** The chapel was painted, the woodwork refinished and a new ceiling and lighting installed in April 1991 in Loving memory of Carrie (Harris) Miller and Wilton R. Glenny, MD

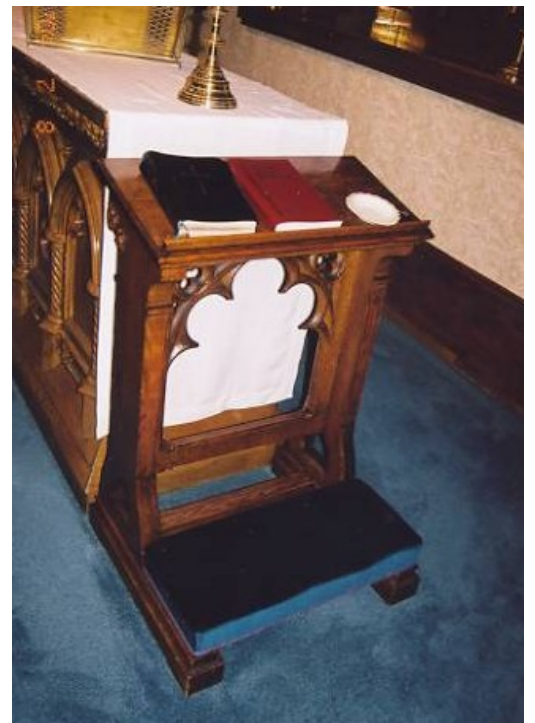

# Parish Hall

The parish hall, built on the second level, was part of the parish house construction of 1905-1906.

In 1988, the wood ceiling was covered by a drop ceiling to conserve heat. In **December 2000**, the room was painted through the contributions of Warren Bradley, Carol Stone-Field, Miriam Baker Trust, Emmeline Stone, Anna Maley, Betty Brennan, and Charoletteann Petlansky. In **2003**, the lighting was replaced when the church was rewired at a cost of \$140,000.

## Parish Hall and Stairway



### **Stairway leading to Parish Hall:**

This stairway as seen in 2005 was renovated during the fuel crisis of 1985. The ceiling was dropped covering one window and the plaster and papered walls were covered with paneling. New stair treads and linoleum, paint and wallpaper in the hallways to the parish hall were given in Memory of Frank P. Schweikert—August 1986

## Baby Grand Piano

There are 2 possible origins of this piano - In August 1968 Miss Miriam Baker gave a small grand piano to the church from her sister, Miss Lulu Baker's estate: or in September 1977, the Schuylkill Council for the Arts asked to store a baby grand piano in our under-croft.





# Lounge



**Mahogany or Cherry Hutch\Cabinet:** It is unknown when or by whom this hutch was given. It possibly arrived in the late 1950s when the lounge was renovated. This cabinet is a treasure trove of memorabilia and antiquity worth taking the time to look through.

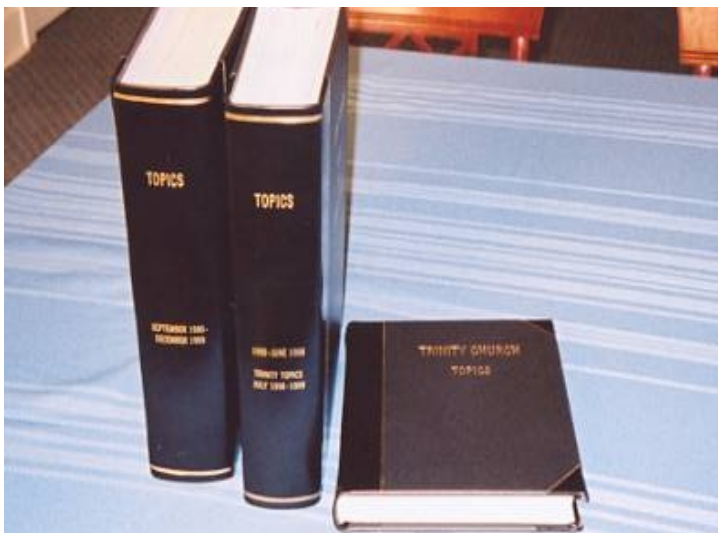

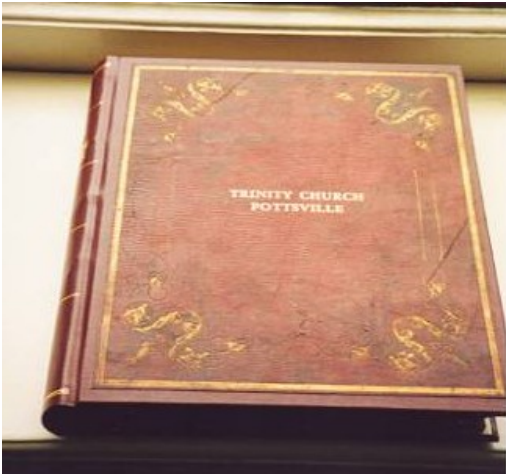

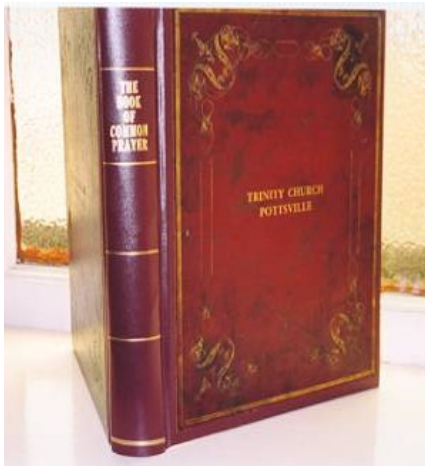

## Parish House - First Floor

### 1905 Reading and Game Rooms to 1957 Reception Area to 1980 Church Offices to 2000 Senior Craft Shop and Choir Rooms

This office area complex, consisting of three rooms, had many uses since being built in 1905. In 1905, originally it was the Men's Reading Room in the outer area, the Men's and Boy's Game room, and the Rector's area. Around the 1940s it was a reception or waiting area and the secretary's office and rector's office. In the 1980s, as additional programs were created in Trinity Center and Marion Price Trust and for the Charles Baber Cemetery, the secretary was moved to the reception room with the inner rooms for the other church programs and the back room as the rector's office. Upon the purchase of the Church House in Dec. 2001, the offices were moved across

the street and this area became the Senior Craft Shop in the outer reception room, the choir vesting room in the middle, and the music director and organists room in the back office. This office complex was refurbished in 1997 with new carpets, paint, lights, and some new cabinets.)

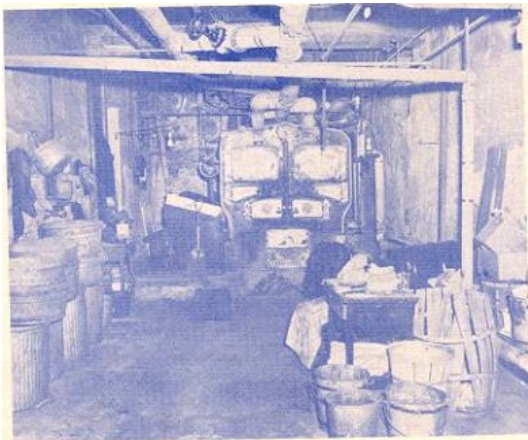

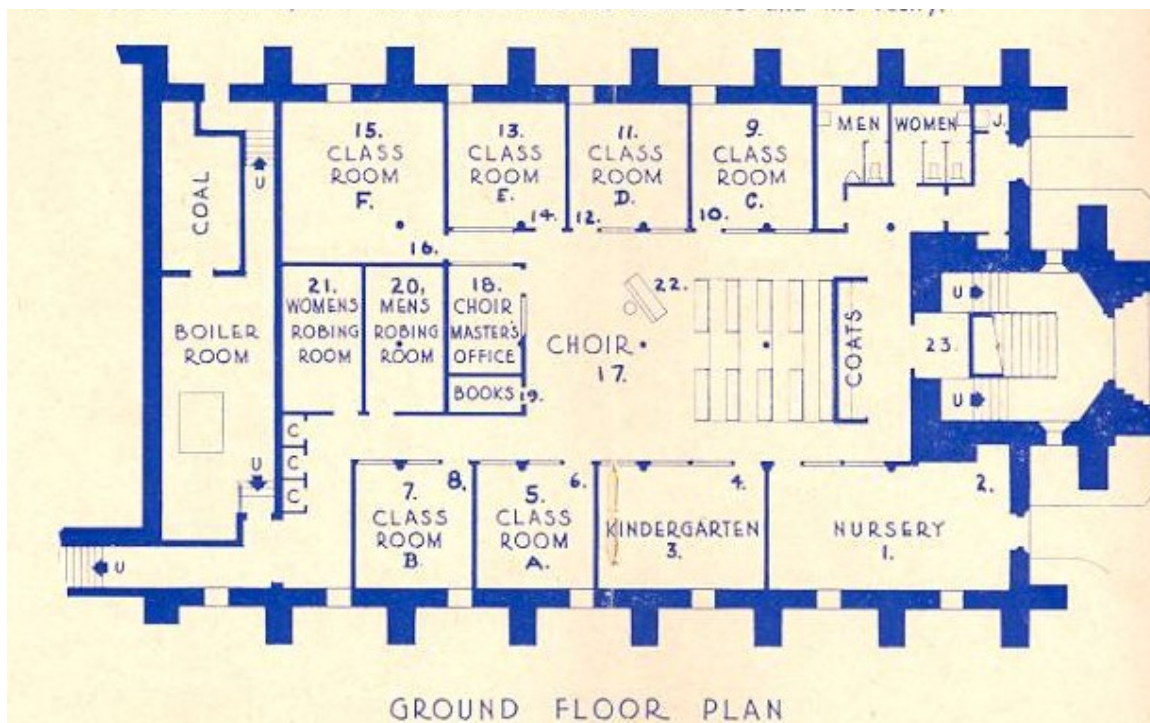

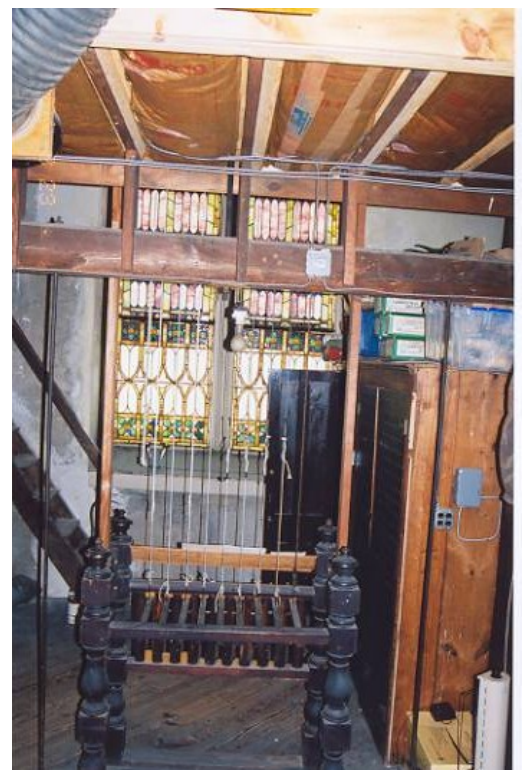
# Bell Tower

**Chime of Nine Bells:** Given by Charles Baber in May 1874



The person with the bells is Linda Campbell Woodford, Boston, MA who repaired the bells in May 1981.

The chime of nine bells weighs a total of 9,617 pounds. Each one plays a different key and is a different weight:  
E flat-2,465 pounds; F flat-1,610 pounds; G -1,300 pounds; A flat-1,055 pounds; B flat-858 pounds;  
C-725 pounds; D flat-639 pounds; D-551 pounds; and E-414 pounds





# Graves

## Graves in Second Street Courtyard aside of the Parish House:

George W. Farquhar Born May 20, 1799 Died February 22, 1846

Amelia wife of George W. Farquhar Died September 1, 1888 in the 88th year of her life.

These graves are part of Lot #3 which is adjacent to Lot #4 where the church stands. This lot was purchased for a cemetery plot by the church in July 1839, before Mount Laurel Cemetery was bought.



It is unknown when this building was built on Lot #3 and attached to the church. The building is built over several tombstones.

1. Sallie wife of Henry Pleasants who Departed this Life October 15, 1860 age (unreadable) years 18 days

The following were buried in plot #7 which was purchased by Benjamin Bannan

1. Mary wife of Ray Bannan Died April 1, 1851 Age 38 years
2. John Newell Bannan Born August 25, 1839 Died November 20, 1863
3. N. Jamian Bannan Born April 22, 1805 Died July 31, 1875
4. William Nowell Bannan Age 10 days

The next grave was plot #11 purchased by Edward Owen Parry

1. Mary Ruth Parry Born January 16, 1811 Died February 28, 1811

The following plots cannot be established because only initials were used, they are small and could be children –they are where the Perry and the Bannan plots meet.

1. Small tombstone initials B. B. (Bannan)
2. Small tombstone initials S. P. (Parry)
3. Small tombstone initials M. B. (Bannan)





## Trinity Church - 2002 Exterior Before Water Auth. Construction



**Episcopal Sign:** In November 1972, an Episcopal sign was placed on the outside of the church and was placed In Memory of Mrs. Thomas Powell by Mrs. Harold Kelly. This sign has since been replaced, but not as a memorial.

**Landscaping:** Landscaping was done in 1957 as part of the \$206,000 church renovation.

**Landscaping:** In October 1989, landscaping of Holly bushes, a dogwood tree, and a Weeping Cherry tree were Given In Memory of Elizabeth Ann Miller Mykovich by Family and Friends - October 1989 (The holly bushes are on the Howard Ave. side of the church behind the wrought iron fence.)



**Landscaping:** Azalea bushes on front terrace of church and a Japanese Lilac tree on the playground side were planted and given by the Schuylkill Water Auth. and Kevin Kraft of Little Mountain Stone after they removed the cherry tree- Fall 2002

The church's exterior after the Schuylkill County Municipal Authority razed the buildings south of the church and built their new building -2002.

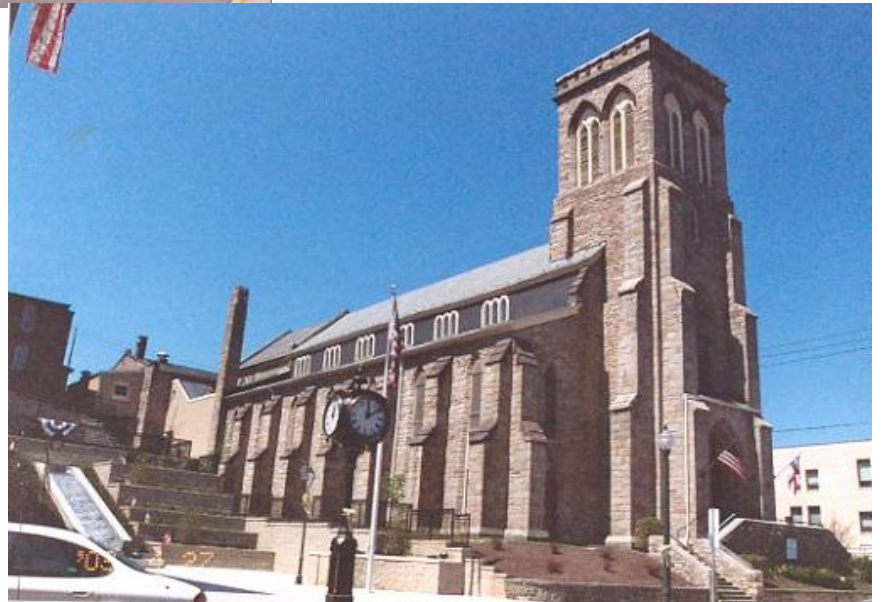
New sidewalks were installed in front of the church by the Municipal Authority - 2002

The clock and waterfall are the Municipal Authority's.

### Trinity Center For Children's playground:

In exchange for a 3 foot easement along side the church's property, the Municipal Authority built a playground for TCC - May 2002.

The railing around the playground and the chopped rubber sponge ground cover was purchased in July 2004 and paid for from a grant TCC received.



In August 2003, three sections of oriental fence were installed on the Centre St. side by TCC and the church as security for the children and the playground area.





## Sanctuary Woodwork

The pictures shown on this page and the following two pages are not memorials, but the workmanship is beautiful and deserves recognition. The work of the chairs (misericords), the wood screens behind the choir and the choir stalls were done in 1921-1922 when the sanctuary was built. The work was done by Gerald Evans, Phila.



**Misericords:** Tip-up seats with projections under the seat which when turned up afford some support when one is standing and one's elbows can rest on the arms of the stalls. An older use of the misericords was to provide support for the elderly clergy or monks who had to stand during the entire service.

## Miscellaneous

The chancel chairs and the two Litany desks are used during a wedding.



Originally where the organ pipes and the wood panels are, there were to be two stained glass windows as depicted in the Zantinger, Borie, and Mediary 1922 rendering.

The beautiful ornate woodwork of the choir stalls and the organ chamber. This work, along with the wood screen and door at the Howard Ave. entrance was done by Gerald Evans of Phila. - 1922

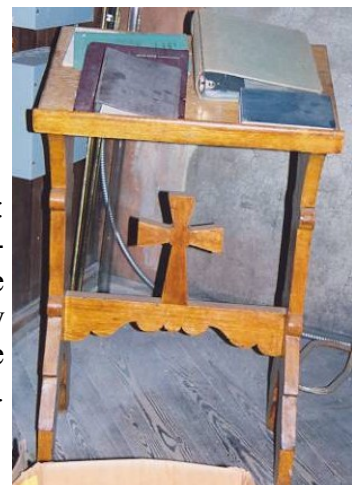


**Table** at Howard Ave. entrance:

**Stairs and railing** leading to narthex from Centre Street. The natural beauty shines through after removing the outer coats of stain in August 2004. The banister rails and spindles are thought to have been constructed in 1887 by William H. Bohler, a local contractor, when the front entrance was renovated and the enclosed vestibule was built.

**Litany Desk:** Stored in the bell tower:  
Its age and origin are unknown. However, the cross seems to match the cross engraved in the doorway woodwork at the Chapel of the Resurrection.
